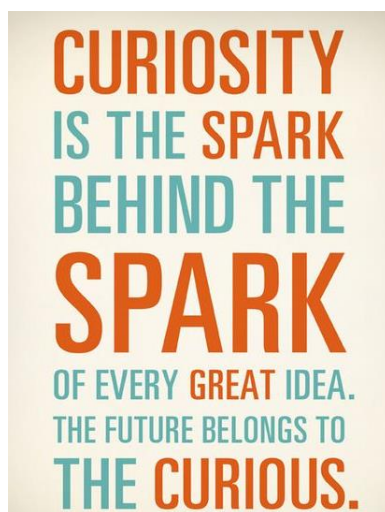




Curiosity
